FOX LAKE PLAN IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Lake Plan Implementation Committee met in August and set some short term objectives and assigned some actions. Tom Gillette (Committee Chair and FLA vice-President) continues working with the Town of Huntsville to get parts of the plan incorporated into the Huntsville Plan which is being revised in 2012.

More than anything else, we need interested association members to take on some of the many activities recommended in the plan. *A Lake Plan for Fox Lake* is available on the FLA website. Some specific items where we would like help include:

Determining how to get legislation in place to prevent boathouses being built on Fox Lake and working towards that goal

Benthic Monitoring – this involves sampling small things growing in the shallow water.

Training is available and it would be fun and very educational for children (would make a great science project).

Fox Lake History – collect and organize documents and photos; possibly create a book

LAKE STEWARD'S REPORT

The October 10th water clarity reading was an impressive 2.5 metres. The conditions were perfect, with bright sun and calm waters. The six readings over the season averaged 2.0 metres.

Next summer, Fox Lake will participate in the Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters Invasive Specie Watch program. We'll acquiring the sample which will be submitted to OFAH for

expert analysis. This will determine if Fox Lake has been infected with spiny water fleas or zebra mussels. We have also acquired some "Stop Invasive Species" signs which we hope to post at the various places where power boats are launched.

ISLAND REFORESTATION

The island in the middle of the south end of the lake has been heavily used over the years and in 2010 there was a fire probably caused by an incorrectly doused campfire, that destroyed vegetation primarily on the north side. The result is that most of the small vegetation that covered almost all of the island has been lost and there are few small trees coming along to replace the mature trees that remain. The island is in danger of being eroded down to just a pile of rocks.

The Association plans to do some planting of vegetation (mostly trees) on the island. Christa Sharp is coordinating this activity. She has created a schematic plan and list of local species to be planted. The intent is to transplant trees and other plants from the land surrounding the lake to the island. If you would like to plant a few trees (great memorial activity) please contact Christa for details of where and what would be useful. Once again, a little work by lots of people will make a huge difference.

BOATING

Over the years, we continue to see more boats and larger and faster boats on the lake. It is a very small lake so please remember to be safe and courteous at all times. Some issues of particular concern:

1. As much as possible, minimize wakes and keep wakes as far from shore as possible. The lake's shore line vegetation (water lilies etc.) and beaches are fragile and boats at docks and on beaches can be damaged by large wakes.
2. When pulling tubes, water skiers, knee boards etc. be sure there is a spotter and that the driver remains very aware of other boats on the lake, particularly small craft.
3. Keep well clear of boats pulling tubes, skiers etc. There are reports of other boats jumping wakes of tow boats. This is extremely hazardous should a person fall off a tube or board.
4. Swimmers should not be far off shore without an accompanying boat; particularly on wavy days or with low sun angles, swimmers are not very visible and vulnerable to high speed boats (see 2. above).

Also remember that there are no public boat launches on Fox Lake. Camp Winnebago does not allow any boat launching or removal when camp is in session (late June to mid-August) and

all use of their beach must be arranged in advance by calling the Camp. Other launch sites must also be pre-arranged with the owners. Be aware also that boat launching is a significant pathway for introduction of invasive species. Be sure that any boat being put into the lake is properly cleaned (including the trailer) if it has been in other waters (including other Muskoka Lakes – the spiny water flea is in Lake Vernon but not Fox Lake yet).

PASSINGS

Evelyn Porter passed away October 27, 2011, in her 94th year. She and her husband Jim cottaged on the east side Fox Lake, starting around 1950, for over 40 years along with their children Lyn, Bob and Lorna. She is fondly remembered by long time east-siders for many things, including starting, with Jim, the annual East Side Thanksgiving Wine and Cheese Party.

Gordon Finbow died May 6, 2011 in Huntsville. Gord was a long time Fox Lake cottager and resident. In 1955, Gordon married Gwen Yule and began coming to Fox Lake for vacations. He began teaching at Huntsville High in 1965. He designed and built a home on the east side of Fox Lake where he and Gwen raised four children – Susan, Jamie, Carol and David. Gord was active in the Fox Lake Association and served as President. He was one of the co-founders of the Fox Lake Regatta. He is missed by all who knew him.

Great-grandmother takes first place in regatta canoe race at 91



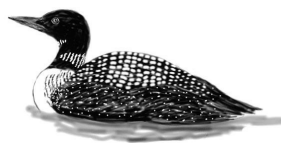
Yule and Walden paddle their classic Canadian canoe to a first-place finish.

HUNTSVILLE - Barbara Yule and her granddaughter Jennifer Walden paddled to first place in the grandparent-grandchild canoe race at the Fox Lake Regatta last month. Over 100 regatta spectators had the pleasure of watching Yule and Walden paddle Yule's beautifully maintained classic canoe in perfect unison and cross the finish line ahead of about a dozen other canoes.

Yule said she and her late husband, Glen, bought the canoe about 65 years ago from Glen's uncle, Harold Robinson, who had had it for many years.

"I think the canoe is about the same age as I am," said Yule. "And I'm 91."

The canoe is an original canvas covered cedar strip made by the Canadian Canoe Company. The grandparent-grandchild canoe race was introduced to the Fox Lake Regatta this year in recognition of the multi-generational families around the lake, many of which have a long history in the area.
